## An Overview of Croquet New South Wales by Steve Miles

Steve Miles is a past president of Cammeray Croquet Club, and a fine croquet player (current handicap of 2). He has been treasurer of Croquet NSW for some years.

Croquet NSW (CNSW) is the state body of Croquet Clubs in NSW. Each state body is affiliated with Croquet Australia (ACA).

There are 69 member clubs representing more than 3,200 registered players. 70% of players reside outside Sydney. 3,000 players play GC but less than 500 play AC. Gateball and Ricochet are also increasing in popularity.

Through your affiliation fees, CNSW provides:

- Support for State Teams in GC and AC. Both NSW Teams are current Australian Champions. Cammeray members Joanne Brown, Peter Landrebe and Rosie Landrebe were members of the successful Eire Cup (AC) team.
- An administration portal and insurance programs. The insurance programs provide public liability insurance as well as accident insurance.
- Coaching and Refereeing Programs through ACA accredited programs all supported by CNSW resources.
- Tournaments for AC, GC, Ricochet and Gateball players at all levels
- State Government recognition. Most recently this has resulted in financial support for Croquet Clubs

You can find out more by reading the monthly CNSW newsletter which is emailed out to all clubs. Many clubs (but not Cammeray – though it is on our website) distribute this newsletter to members and you can see past issues at croquet-nsw.org.

Cammeray Croquet Club is a key supporter of resources for AC croquet. This includes providing referees and also hosting CNSW tournaments. David Stanton and Mike Hughes are members of the CNSW Tournament Committee and David in particular personally manages many tournaments.

A key concern is the decline in popularity of AC. GC players of course already have half of the skills needed to play AC but they are reluctant to play a game that takes so long. Most GC games are finished in 40 minutes. The challenge is to find a version of AC that maintains the skills needed but does not take so long.

There are new CNSW coaching programs which are yet to be adopted by Cammeray. These programs include video resources providing extra guidance to players and are worth investigating.

To support regional areas CNSW has established hubs to serve as a focus for providing services through courses and tournaments. These hubs exist at Coutts Crossing, Port Macquarie, Toronto, Strathfield, Canberra and Nowra. Sydney probably needs another hub. This could be an opportunity for Cammeray, perhaps in co-operation with Chatswood?

Like all volunteer run organisations things run smoothly if a lot of people do a little bit of work. Why not have a think about how you can help CNSW grow and support croquet in NSW?
