Repairs

For over a year the Committee has been chasing North Sydney Council to address various issues around the structure of the clubhouse and surrounds. These include the leaking roof, staining and water damage to the ceiling, the timber facia and guttering, repainting of the clubhouse and the undermining of the tennis courts on our northern boundary. We have been met with a wall of silence, inaction and obfuscation. Now we know the reason why. The Council is close to insolvent due to the haemorrhaging of money into the pool project. They have a backlog on works of \$69m and have a deficit of \$3.6m this financial year. They are considering raising rates between 65% and 111%. Until Council have restored their financial situation to something sustainable, it is unlikely that the remediation of the clubhouse will be addressed. The committee will, however, continue to pursue all avenues open to us to bring a resolution to this matter. - Malcolm Sheldon

The Laws of Croquet – bisques after time

At Jamberoo an interesting situation arose regarding the laws. With time about to be called, a player hit a shot and called out for a half-bisque before the ball had stopped. Time then went. Law 61.2.1 says that a bisque may not be taken after time has been called. However, the definition of when a bisque is taken is <u>not</u> when the player indicates the intention to take a bisque, but when the first stroke of the turn using the bisque is played (Law 61.2.2). So, if time goes before the player has played the first shot using the bisque, then the bisque cannot be taken, and the turn ends.
